Spectrum Institute Grants

The Spectrum Institute for Teaching and Learning (SITL) funds multiple grants annually specific to research or presentations conducted around the Spectrum of Teaching Styles. Each recipient of a SITL research grant will receive a financial award based upon one of the following three criteria:

Research Grants - Submit a proposal of a Spectrum of Teaching Styles research project in any subject matter (e.g., physical education, elementary classroom, secondary mathematics, etc.) to enter the competitive process.

<u>Video Episode Grants</u> - Record a teaching example of one of the Spectrum Teaching Styles A-K for posting by the Spectrum Institute on our website, YouTube, and other SITL educational curriculum.

Conference Grants - Mini-grants of \$1,500 to Spectrum of Teaching Styles advocates who are presenting at an International level conference where submitted presentation abstracts are peer reviewed. The presentation must be specific to the Spectrum of Teaching Styles, practical or research-based.

Sara Ashworth Graduate Student Assistantship-Scholarship Awards

What and for Whom?

- For graduate students pursuing a doctoral or master's degree
- An award will fund costs associated with the completion of the degree at the given graduate student recipient's university
- Fundable items include stipend, tuition and fees, fringe for university, escalation from year to year, and costs associated with the student's Spectrum research
- Funding for a master's degree up to 2 years and doctoral degree up to 4 years
- Required outcomes of an award recipient include presenting and publishing Spectrum research <u>Academic Advisor</u>
- Criteria to serve as an academic advisor of an assistantship-scholarship recipient includes an established record of Spectrum research and teaching the Spectrum.
- An academic advisor will receive an annual stipend while overseeing an assistantship-scholarship recipient.
