A LOOK BACK AT 2024

In our third year of being in operation, we reopened all of our grant programs for applications. These programs are: the **Spectrum Research Grant, Conference Grant,** and **Sample Spectrum Episode Grant**. We are pleased to say that we had more people apply for and be awarded our various grants than ever before. For example, this year, we were able to award research grants to seven research teams. Furthermore, we were able to support the expansion of the Spectrum of Teaching Styles by sponsoring presentations at several international conferences. There were also a few other things we did this year. First, we ran our annual workshop series featuring presentations from our 2023 Spectrum Research Grant winners along with a few other Spectrum colleagues who wished to share their work. We also awarded the Outstanding Journal Publication of the Year to professors Kiliç and Ince from Turkey for their research article titled, *Perceived use and value of reproductive, problem-solving, and athlete-initiated teaching by coaches and athletes.* Moreover, we finalized a contract with a Japanese publisher for the translation of Mosston and Ashworth's (2008) Spectrum book.



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Our Mission:

The Mission of the Spectrum Institute for Teaching and Learning is to promote, enhance, disseminate, and propagate the Spectrum of Teaching Styles. The Spectrum of Teaching Styles is a theory based on learner and teacher decision-making, and guided by four principles, (a) universal, (b) nonversus, (c) non-idiosyncratic, and (d) common terminology. The SITL will provide a focus/center/means for teachers, teacher educators, pedagogical scholars, and curriculum developers to study and perfect the art and science of teaching through the Spectrum of Teaching Styles.

SOME GRANT INFORMATION

We are proud to fund research about the Spectrum of Teaching Styles. With that in mind, we have an open call for applications for our **Conference Grant** and **Sample Spectrum Episode Grant**.

The conference grant is for those who are planning on presenting about the Spectrum at an international conference. Winners can get up to \$1,000 USD to help with traveling ex-



penses, conference application fees, and any other associated expenses.

In addition, we are offering \$500 USD for recordings of sample Spectrum style episodes to add to the library on our YouTube page. Applicants can submit an episode in any language, but we will require a document with time stamps and subtitles. We have the ability to blur faces in the video if that is a concern for any-one being recorded. Once we have the episode recording and application form,



we will review them and let the applicant(s) know the final decision.

We will also reopen the **Outstanding Journal Article Award** for articles written in 2024. The window for nominations will open December 1st, 2024 and close March 1st, 2025. At the same time, we will

be introducing a new article award, which we will provide more information about as we get closer.

Furthermore, we will host our annual workshop series from March to May 2025. We will be reaching out to colleagues soon to see who would like to share the work they have conducted with the Spectrum over the last year.

We will continue to add to and expand on our MOOC courses, and we are planning on doing another Spectrum symposium at the upcoming AIESEP conference in St. Petersburg, FL. Moreover, we will work on and release information about the Spectrum conference we will host in Ancient Olympia, Greece in Spring 2026.


